Building Hope



Hope Gospel Mission opened Building Hope in October 2006 as a building material and office furniture re-use center. Since 2006 it has expanded twice into its present 25,000 sq. ft. of retail space. New customers come in weekly and are amazed at the selection, quality, and value of the products they find. Building Hope is the largest Re-Use store in the state and has thus become a destination store for many people in western and central Wisconsin.

Products on display at the store include office furniture and major appliances including washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators and freezers. Building supplies include doors, windows, kitchen and bathroom cabinets, plumbing fixtures, flooring, and lighting.

Building Hope promotes environmental stewardship in our community. Hundreds of thousands of pounds of building materials have been salvaged and made available for re-use. The store provides paid job training for residents of the men's shelter enrolled in the Renewed Hope Program. Interns work to complete their classroom training while having a paid position in the store. They pay down their debts and save for the future when they graduate and leave the Mission. Over \$90,000 in wages were paid to program participants last year.

Profits from Building Hope help support the Men's Shelter and Ruth House ministries of Hope Gospel Mission. Financial donations to Hope Gospel Mission are never used to fund the store.

You can help support the work of Building Hope by shopping in the store, donating reusable building materials or office furniture, and telling others about the store. You can volunteer as an individual or as a group. There are opportunities to volunteer in the store as well as job site work days doing deconstruction work. If you are, or know of, a retired handyman, we have very rewarding volunteer work available.
