

# **Brightening the Future with Education**

Over a year ago, Hope Gospel Mission's education center reached capacity and was bursting at its seams. That led to opening the Solomon Learning Center in August of 2010. The Solomon Learning Center was designed to take all the employment readiness programs we offered to Hope Gospel Mission residents, Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University class, and computer introduction classes and offer those programs to the general public. Additionally, we've added Bible study correspondence classes and Leadership classes; and it's all available to the public. Coming soon will be a Biblical conflict resolution seminar and we are currently in the final stages of state approval to teach office administration classes. We expect those to be ready in the next couple months.

Since opening last year, the Solomon Learning Center has been able to increase the resources available to residents and graduates of the Mission. We have more space, a library, tutoring areas, separate classrooms, and diligent staff and tutors who are dedicated to helping people get to the next level.

Students at the Solomon Learning Center are not just

looking for a job – they are spending 12 months or more developing themselves into the best employees they can be. They are addressing root issues that interfere with their success, and they are putting a lot of effort into self-development. Recently, one employer who hired a Hope Gospel Mission Renewed Hope Program resident called and asked us to send more people who have completed our work readiness program because they were impressed with their work ethic.

# From the President & Founder: Mark Donnelly



On Friday, June 10th, a wall-breaking ceremony was held for the Sojourner House, a new 40 bed homeless shelter for single men and women, located at 618

S. Barstow Street in Eau Claire. It was designed to replace the current Warming Center which has operated for the past two years. It will be operated by Catholic Charities with help from other community partners that are part of the Eau Claire Shelter Coalition, a local group of concerned organizations, churches and individuals trying to meet the temporary needs of homeless individuals in our area that, for whatever reason, are not currently being met by other local organizations. Their goal is to open a no-questions asked homeless shelter by Oct. 1, 2011. The shelter would be open year round from early evening to morning and would provide a safe place to sleep, shower, do laundry and have breakfast. This poses the question of why there is a need for another shelter in our area and why Hope Gospel Mission is not able to accommodate them?

Hope Gospel Mission currently offers our services, with Christ-centered principles and methods, to many individuals with similar problems. Sometimes for safety reasons we must turn people away. In order to receive our services, we require a person to be sober and drug free when they enter the mission. If not sober, they may come back and see us when they are. Sometimes we will refer them for detox at the local hospital before coming into the mission. Those with a diagnosed mental illness are required to take their prescribed medications in order to stay with us (for safety reasons). We refer them to our local hospital or the Free Clinic to get their medications and will then allow them to stay, unless they would pose a danger to our staff and residents. At this time we are unable to accept higher-level sex offenders. We currently offer emergency and help stays for up to 30 days and a two-year Renewed Hope Program for those who are ready to deal with the root issues in their lives that keep them homeless. Sometimes people aren't ready to deal with those root issues and choose not to stay with us. However, they know help is available when they are ready to change. Because of the reasons listed above, we still have people in our area that are homeless, even though help is available to them. This is the group of people that the new shelter is trying to address.

Hope Gospel Mission has offered our assistance to the Sojourner House to help this needy segment of our community. We want to make our programs available to the homeless individuals that will come through their doors. It is our desire that they will get to the point where they want the life changing help we offer through our two-year program, thus breaking the cycle of homelessness in their lives and becoming productive members of society.

We wish the new shelter the best and look forward to working with them.
